Principal's report

SD8 held a public survey on its 2022–2023 budget.

From the District: Thank you for participating in the District's survey regarding its budget for next year, 2022-2023. We are asking for your feedback using your knowledge of the District.

Next year is expected to be a "very tight" year, with forecast operating revenues decreasing by 13.5% due to projected enrolment decline and no increase in the funding factors by the Ministry. As well funded COVID related items have ceased.

Our staffing costs for salary and benefits have been increased due to contractual obligations under our current collective agreements. There is an additional increase to employee benefit cost. Also, there is a new sick leave entitlement which will impact our relief or casual staff. There are no wage increases added to next year as wage settlements have not yet been determined. Hopefully as in the past, the province will fund the settlement. We are projecting an enrolment decline in both our regular students and in the number of unique students; therefore, we must adjust our staffing levels in our classrooms to compensate for this decline.

Service and supplies have increased due to inflation. Further complicating this year's process is the accuracy of predicting the cost of goods as prices seem to be increasing rapidly.

All the above factors put significant pressure on the District's budget leaving us presently with a \$1.42 million-dollar deficit.

Currently we are looking in all areas of the budget for efficiencies in order to provide a balanced budget at our May 24, 2022, Board Meeting when the Board of Education will need to pass the 2022/23 Budget Bylaw.

- South Nelson Elementary is currently in a teacher layoff position for 2022-23 for a few reasons, including many fewer Ks entering than grade 5s moving to Trafalgar and a contractual obligation to give layoff notices with at least 30 teaching days' notice. Some factors over the coming months could change this situation, particularly more student registrations. Current teacher seniority staffing list includes all teachers with continuing contracts assigned to South Nelson.
- We may need to look at running music differently for next year which could include an Artist in the Classroom project that works well in other schools. More about this at our June PAC meeting.
- For any further questions, feel free to set up a time to talk with Dan.
- \$40 per student supplies fee will continue for next year for elementary students. Parents do not need to purchase supplies as all will be purchased through the school.
