Principal's report

Mrs. C's class call Breakfast Bins, which provides snacks and breakfast food. Subsidized hot lunches are

available through PAC. We have another project that sends bags of groceries home with students over

Safety

- Dan and Daphne met with a new city planner. There was talk about having representatives from the
 Nelson family of schools on city traffic safety committee.
- Parents should report any traffic infractions to the police and to Dan.

DPAC/BCCPAC

 There is an active resolution to advocate for increased traffic control around schools (ticketing, enforcement, etc.).

School

- Mike Clyde from Pedego Bikes is open to working with the PAC to raffle off an electric bike as a fundraiser.
- PAC is on stand-by to help with a Grade 5 celebration.
- Sarah Canale's brother who works at Gerricks is open to doing a bike-safety presentation. In the past, the Nelson Police have come to bike-safety day.
- Kate and Tanji looked into turf options:
 - The process would require digging down and backfilling the area with crushed rock, pouring
 a cement perimeter, and then enclosing it with a loose net.
 - o Ideal sizing would be 45 ft W x 100 ft L (roughly 1/3 of the field).
 - We can talk to St. Joe's and Nelson Baseball about supplier options.
 - The turf would be ~\$45k for just the turf (install could be ~\$15k).
 - Timeline could be 2–3 weeks.
 - Maintenance is minimal.

Fundraising

- We will do one more grocery card fundraiser this year.
- We will likely do one more coffee fundraiser this year.

 Applications for the Superintendent position are open. The district is hoping to have a new Superintendent by August 1.
